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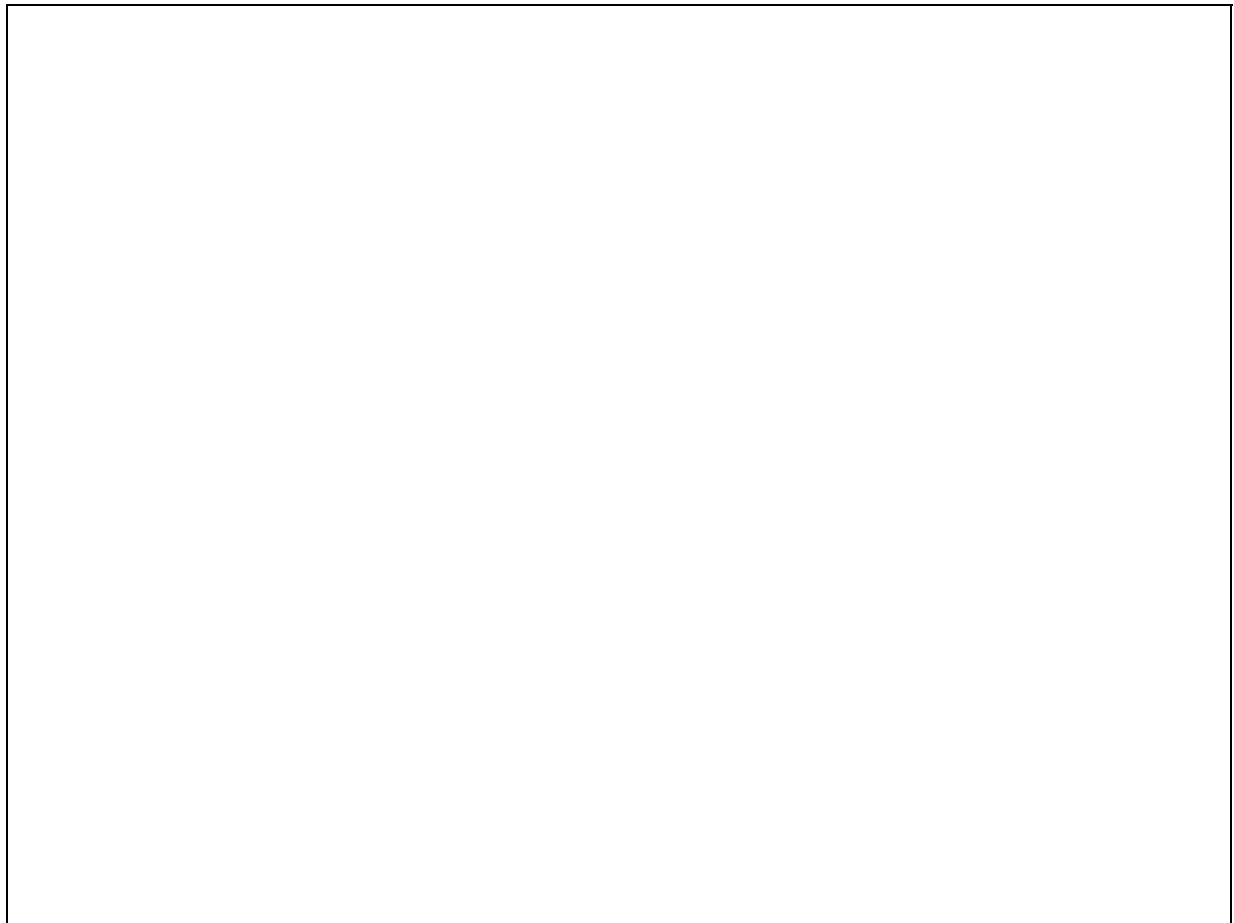
A Zuck-Created Nightmare: Facebook Engineers Admit They Have No Clue Where Your Personal Data Is Stored Or Which Spy Agencies Hoover It Up

Recently unsealed court transcripts relating to a lawsuit over Facebook's mishandling of user data reveals that company engineers claim to have no idea what personal information they collect on users or where it's stored.

The Intercept [reports](#) that in March, two veteran Facebook engineers found themselves being questioned about the company's collection of user data in a hearing for the ongoing lawsuit over the company's alleged mishandling of private user information relating to the Cambridge Analytica scandal.

A transcript of the hearing was recently unsealed and reveals that the engineers were questioned about what sort of user information Facebook stores and where it is located. The engineersâ had a simple response â they donât know.

During a hearing with special master Daniel Garrie, a court-appointed subject-matter expert tasked with resolving a disclosure impasse, Garrie attempted to get the company to provide a definitive accounting of where Facebook user data might be stored across the companyâs 55 subsystems. Both Facebook engineers struggled to even guess where that information might be stored.

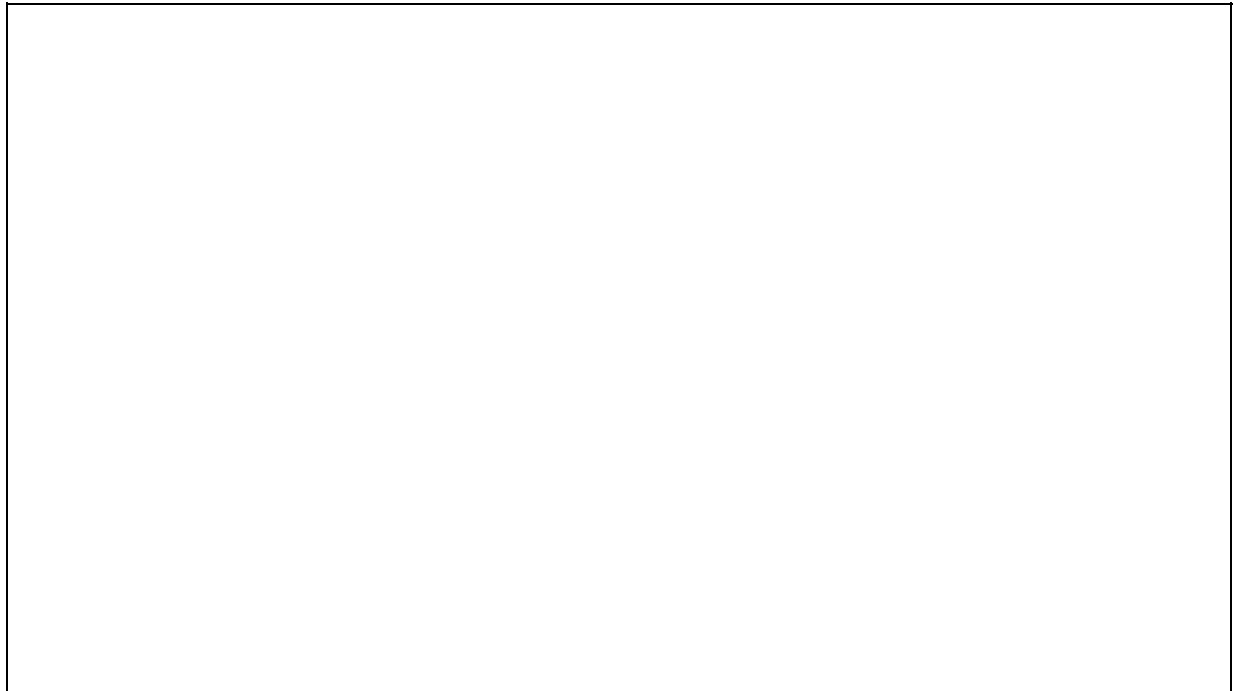
Garrie stated:â Iâm just trying to understand at the most basic level from this list what weâre looking at,â to which Facebook engineering director Eugene Zarashaw responded:â I donât believe thereâs a single person that exists who could answer that question. It would take a significant team effort to even be able to answer that question.â

When asked about how Facebook might track down all the data associated with a single user account, Zarashaw responded:â It would take multiple teams on the ad side to track down exactly the â where the data flows. I would be surprised if thereâs even a single person that can answer that narrow question conclusively.â

When asked about this, a Facebook spokesperson simply told the Intercept:â We have made â and continue making â significant investments to meet our privacy commitments and obligations, including extensive data controls.â

Facebook Lets Anyone View Your Profile And Scam You Using Your Phone Number



A recent report by [Tech Crunch](#) states that phone numbers linked to Facebook accounts could be used to look up profiles. Last year, the company had pestered users into registering their phone numbers for **two-factor authentication**.

The problem here is that users **cannot opt out** of this feature and anyone with or without an account can **look up user profiles** just by using their phone numbers. Facebook had admitted last year to using the data collected under the guise of security to target users with advertisements.

Recently, a tweet by Jeremy Burge went viral as it detailed the use of a **Unique ID** that is used to link your identity **across multiple platforms** on the internet.

For years Facebook claimed the adding a phone number for 2FA was only for security. Now it can be searched and there's no way to disable that. pic.twitter.com/zpYhuwADMS

This feature **cannot be turned off** completely by users and is set to â everyoneâ (can look-up profiles) by default. Jay Nancarrow, Spokesperson of Facebook, stated that the settings were not new and apply to phone numbers added by users to their profiles.

A reporter with The Telegraph was alarmed when her profile could be searched using her phone number which she had never given to Facebook.

This meant that the popular social networking platform was using other sources to find the phone numbers of its users. Zeynep Tufekci, a leading security expert states *“Using security to further weaken privacy is a lousy move especially since phone numbers can be hijacked to weaken security”*.

Facebook admits to stealing email contacts of 1.5 million users

Facebook has confirmed that the email contacts it collected from approximately 1.5 million users since May 2016 have been uploaded to the site unwittingly. Those contact lists belong to individuals who were creating a new account with the social media giant.

The company's admission comes after a security researcher called public attention to Facebook's [harvesting of the users' email passwords](#) as part of a verification step during signup. After entering the email password, Facebook would then go on importing the users' contact lists without their consent. Of course, this practice goes against the grain of personal data security standards. Facebook is not immediately available for comment as of this writing.

The collected email contacts serve a key role in the social media giant's ad targeting activities and other efforts to suggest friends for users to add on the network. Facebook was quick to clarify that it did not gain access to email content. However, data mishandling of this sort still indicates an oversight where the company's security practices are concerned. Facebook said it has since been removing those uploaded contact lists.

It is not clear for now how many contact emails exactly were uploaded to Facebook's system. The latest privacy misstep is the latest in a spate of scandals that hit the Menlo Park-based internet giant over the past few weeks including the [improper storing of user passwords in plain text](#) and a massive [data leak of user data](#) by third-party apps.

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HOW TO PUT CORRUPT GOOGLE AND FACEBOOK OUT OF BUSINESS

Facebook released its [Q1 earnings report](#) this week, which included this bombshell:

â In the first quarter of 2019, we reasonably estimated a probable loss and recorded an accrual of \$3.0 billion in connection with the inquiry of the FTC into our platform and user data practices...We estimate that the range of loss in this matter is \$3.0 billion to \$5.0 billion.â

The fine isn't particularly interesting on its ownâ Facebook can afford to pay \$5 billion. What's fascinating is whether the FTC's forthcoming decision will set a precedent for regulating big tech.

First, let's unpack the fine, and why it won't phase Facebook. Facebook reported \$15.07 billion in revenue in Q1 of this year, up from \$11.96 billion in Q1 of 2018. It made enough money in a single quarter to eat the expected fine while maintaining profitability and continuing to move forward. Facebook's stock even surged

through the news, peaking at a nearly 8% increase the following morning.

While \$5 billion is a big number, it's not make-or-break for Facebook. The question of whether the FTC will regulate the way Facebook collects and abuses user data, however, is.

Advertising was responsible for 99% of Facebook's Q1 revenue. If the FTC does anything that would make Facebook's ad platform less powerful—like changing the way Facebook can use user data for targeting, for example—it will be a blow at the core of its businesses. With companies like Google that are similarly reliant on monetizing user data, most of Silicon Valley is watching for the FTC's final decision—and the precedent it will set.

With this kind of effective investigation by the public ordering elected officials to do their jobs, the criminally corrupt, election manipulating, bribing likes of Facebook and Google can be eliminated within four years

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How Facebook manipulates content, news and political ideologies on behalf of the DNC

With billions of users hooked on to Facebook (FB), it was often believed that Mark Zuckerberg and his team could never successfully police the massive amounts of data that users post every second. However, in the light of the recent data scandal, the company has now offered a peek into how it deals with content that violates rules.

The report covers the company's efforts during a period ranging from October 2017 through March 2018, and the actions taken in the first quarter of 2018. It is also the company's first step towards its ongoing Community Standards enforcement efforts.

During the first quarter, the social media company deleted nearly 837 million posts that were identified as spam, besides disabling nearly 583 million fake accounts. According to Facebook, around 3-4% of the active accounts were not genuine.

Around 21 million posts featuring adult nudity and sexual activity were flagged by the social media company during the quarter. Similarly, they also removed 86% of the posts that had graphic violence and 2.5 million hate speech posts. Facebook said it took off 1.9 million pieces of content that were related to terrorist groups including ISIS and Al-Qaeda.

According to social media giant, improved technology, and machine learning helped in increasing the amount of flagged content. The company added that it is investing heavily in advanced technology to make Facebook a safe networking site.

SF Supervisor Pushes to Remove Bastard Zuckerberg Name From SF General Hospital

San Francisco Supervisor Aaron Peskin is trying to get Facebook CEO Mark Zuckerberg's name removed from a local hospital in response to the recent scandals connected to the social media giant, according to a report in [Business Insider](#).

Peskin on Tuesday asked the city attorney how to go about removing Zuckerberg's name from San Francisco General Hospital, a facility to which Zuckerberg and his wife Priscilla Chan donated \$75 million, Business Insider reported.

Peskin also asked that the city revisit its policy on offering naming rights in exchange for gifts, according to remarks provided to the business site.

Earlier this year, nurses working at the hospital protested over the attachment of the Facebook CEO's name to the facility in the wake of the Cambridge Analytica scandal.

Mark Zuckerberg and Priscilla Chan donated \$75 million to the institution in 2015 in exchange for naming rights. But Peskin believes the name now reflects poorly on the city.

"We'll see what my colleagues in the public think about this, but I think it's a wakeup call to Facebook that it's time to reform their corporate culture," he said.

If the city ultimately approves removing the name, it may have to return some or all of the money donated by Zuckerberg should he request it.

Sean Parker unloads on Facebook "exploiting" human psychology

Parker, 38, now founder and chair of the Parker Institute for Cancer Immunotherapy, spoke yesterday at an Axios event at the National Constitution Center in Philadelphia, about accelerating cancer innovation. In the green room, Parker mentioned that he has become "something of a conscientious objector" on social media.

By the time he left the stage, he jokingly said Mark Zuckerberg will probably block his account after reading this:

- "When Facebook was getting going, I had these people who would come up to me and they would say, 'I'm not on social media.' And I would say, 'OK. You know, you will be.' And then they would say, 'No, no, no. I value my real-life interactions. I value the moment. I value presence. I value intimacy.' And I would say, ... 'We'll get you eventually.'"
- "I don't know if I really understood the consequences of what I was saying, because [of] the unintended consequences of a network when it grows to a billion or 2 billion people and ... it literally changes your relationship with society, with each other ... It probably interferes with productivity in weird ways. God only knows what it's doing to our children's brains."
- "The thought process that went into building these applications, Facebook being the first of them, ... was all about: 'How do we consume as much of your time and conscious attention as possible?'"
- "And that means that we need to sort of give you a little dopamine hit every once in a while, because someone liked or commented on a photo or a post or whatever. And that's going to get you to contribute more content, and that's going to get you ... more likes and comments."
- "It's a social-validation feedback loop ... exactly the kind of thing that a hacker like myself would come up with, because you're exploiting a vulnerability in human psychology."
- "The inventors, creators â it's me, it's Mark [Zuckerberg], it's Kevin Systrom on Instagram, it's all of these people â understood this consciously. And we did it anyway."

P.S. Parker, on life science allowing us to "live much longer, more productive lives": "Because I'm a billionaire, I'm going to have access to better health care so ... I'm going to be like 160 and I'm going to be part of this, like, class of immortal overlords. [Laughter] Because, you know the [Warren Buffett] expression about compound interest. ... [G]ive us billionaires an extra hundred years and you'll know what ... wealth disparity looks like."

Sick Apple, Google And Facebook Use COVID To Legitimize Political Spying And To Profit Off Pandemic

In an effort to profiteer on the coronavirus pandemic, failing Tech goliaths Apple and Google have joined together to pitch criminally unconstitutional software that would assist in contact tracing in order to manipulate voters under the guise of "Pandemic Protection".

From Apple:

Since COVID-19 can be transmitted through close proximity to affected individuals, public health officials have identified contact tracing as a valuable tool to help contain its spread. A number of leading public health authorities, universities, and NGOs around the world have been doing important work to develop opt-in contact tracing technology. To further this cause, Apple and Google will be launching a comprehensive solution that includes application programming interfaces (APIs) and operating system-level technology to assist in enabling contact tracing. This is a more robust solution than an API and would allow more individuals to participate, if they choose to opt in, as well as enable interaction with a broader ecosystem of apps and government health authorities. Privacy, transparency, and consent are of utmost importance in this effort, and we look forward to building this functionality in consultation with interested stakeholders. We will openly publish information about our work for others to analyze.

Hot Air's Allahpundit, however, is skeptical about the ability for people to truly "opt out" of this data mining.

If I understand that correctly, they're going to roll this out quickly by first providing it as an app available for download - called [Contact Tracing](#), neatly enough. Then, in stage two, they're going to build it right into the iOS and Android operating systems while providing some sort of option to opt out. That'll deliver the software to three billion people or so, Allahpundit [wrote](#). An obvious early question: How thorough will the "opt out" be, exactly? Given how much personal information is collected surreptitiously by tech companies already, it's impossible to believe that the movements of opt-outs won't be quietly tracked too. The "opt out" might prevent you from being alerted if someone you've been in contact with is sick, but no one wants to opt out of that part. It's the movement tracking to which some will object. Is that realistically preventable once it's built into the OS? Is there any doubt that eventually the default setting on contact tracing will be to turn it on and force users to turn it off?

Allahpundit noted that Apple and Google's app looks like it will function at least somewhat like a program that Germany instituted to combat the virus, which broadcasts different IDs every 30 minutes as someone goes about their day. If a person tests positive for coronavirus, then it would trace which IDs came into contact with the temporary IDs of the coronavirus-positive person and send them an alert that they may have interacted with someone who had COVID-19.

Of course, as Allahpundit noted, this requires widespread testing for the virus, something we just don't have yet.

Only an idiot would fall for these lies from **Apple, Google And Facebook. They are simply creating a bigger scam to try to suck taxpayer funds from the Treasury and to seek to legitimize their massive spy databases on voters and their habits.**

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Study Finds that Facebook and Google is Bad for Your Mental and Physical Health

A university study has discovered that regular use of Facebook may be detrimental to your health.

Researchers from UC San Diego and Yale cooperated on a project to monitor Facebook usage of 5,208 adult over a two-year period.

But the studyâs [results](#) should be concerning to Facebook users as well as users of all social media, according to Business Insider.

The study found that spending time on Facebook promotes â negative self-comparisonâ and does not actually equal intimacy between people.

Researchers kept tabs on the Facebook userâs â emotional and physical well-being, as well as their body-mass index.â

Researchers say they found that the more time their subjects spent on Facebook, the worse they felt about themselves.

â Overall, our results showed that, while real-world social networks were positively associated with overall well-being, the use of Facebook was negatively associated with overall well-being,â the researchers said in their study. â These results were particularly strong for mental health; most measures of Facebook use in one year predicted a decrease in mental health in a later year.â

â These results were particularly strong for mental health; most measures of Facebook use in one year predicted a decrease in mental health in a later year,â researchers added. â We found consistently that both liking othersâ content and clicking links significantly predicted a subsequent reduction in self-reported physical health, mental health, and life satisfaction.â

The researchers insisted that the â socialâ part of social media is a misnomer. Facebook, Twitter and other so-called social media networks donât really act like real interaction â real social actions â between people.

It is a false impression user get that they are interacting with other people, the researchers say.

â While screen time in general can be problematic, the tricky thing about social media is that while we are using it, we get the impression that we are engaging in meaningful social interaction,â researchers said. â Our results suggest that the nature and quality of this sort of connection is no substitute for the real world interaction we need for a healthy life.â

Their recommendation is to stay off social media.
